Saara Mesterton lives and works in Kerava, a small town close to Helsinki.

After studying music and visual arts, she has had solo exhibitions, including at the Mältinranta Artcenter in Tampere, Galleria Rikhard in Helsinki, Turun taiteilijaseuran Just- galleria in Turku, Emil Danielsson's Stone atelier in Sastamala, Galleria Uusi Kipinä in Lahti (2024) and Galleria Napa in Rovaniemi (2025).

Saara Mesterton has participated in numerous group exhibitions, with the most significant ones taking place at the Kerava Art Museum, Ruukin galleria in Tuusula, Porvoo Art Hall, Art Fair Suomi at Helsinki Cable Factory (2015, 2017, 2019), Artborg 35 in Sipoo, and Galleria Alli in Kerava.
